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
Our Mission

Program Focuses

We're providing a support system that equips students for success.



Education

We cover students' tuition, uniforms, books, and school supplies, and we provide a monthly stipend to help with meals and transportation. By removing these financial barriers, we make sure nothing stands between our students and a quality education.



Technology

At our resource center, students/young professionals can access laptops, high-speed internet, and electricity—resources most Haitian students don't have at home or school. It's a safe, welcoming space where they can study, research, and connect with a supportive community of peers.



Mentoring

We pair university students with qualified personal mentors who offer guidance and encouragement. For many young Haitians—often the first in their families to pursue a college degree—this kind of relational support is transformational. It gives them the direction, confidence, and connection they need to succeed.

Our Impact

47 Sponsored Students

All of these students received our full sponsorship package, ensuring that their school costs are covered, and they are positioned for success.

45 Families

When we pay for a student's education, their entire family benefits because this frees up money for other essential expenses such as food, shelter, and housing.

400 University Students Received Internet

By providing internet at our resource center and a local university campus, we connected at least 400 students to regular high-speed internet access.

1190 Resource Center Visits

Our Community

A Relational Approach

Thrive Ansanm is more than an organization. We are a community. Based in Jérémie, in Haiti's Grand'Anse department, we bring together students, mentors, volunteers, and staff to support young people facing extraordinary challenges. As Haiti's insecurity crisis deepens, Grand'Anse has become increasingly under-resourced, and many students struggle not only with financial need but also with discouragement and declining academic performance.

Therefore, we take a practical and relational approach. We remove financial barriers, connect university students with personal mentors, and host regular student/mentor meetings. Our staff maintains direct communication with students and mentors, and students stay engaged through the Thrive Ansanm WhatsApp group. This ensures that support goes beyond resources—we create a network where students are motivated to excel academically, participate in their community, and develop leadership skills.

47 Sponsored Students

Because of the severe economic crisis in Haiti, many parents can't afford to send their children to school. That's why we provide a full sponsorship package that covers tuition and all essential school-related expenses. We invest in students for the long haul, from kindergarten through university or vocational training.

Most children in Haiti grow up with very limited resources, victims of a class system that diminishes their worth because they are poor. By giving a child the gift of education, we offer far more than knowledge—we give dignity, hope, and the chance for a brighter future.

This support impacts far more than one child. It strengthens an entire household. When parents know their child's education is fully covered, they can use their limited resources for essentials like food, clothing, and shelter.

Students receive ...

Tuition

100% of the student's tuition is covered. We make payments directly to students' schools to ensure accountability.

Books and Supplies

All students receive books and school supplies, and college students receive personal laptops.

Uniforms

We purchase uniforms for all K-12 students and for university students if necessary.

Monthly Stipends

Students receive a monthly stipend to help with the cost of transportation and/or lunches.

School Meals (K-12)

If a student's school offers food, they will be enrolled in a meal plan.

Mentoring (university)

University students in Jeremie are matched with qualified professional mentors.

Technology

Jeremie Resource Center

Located on the campus of the Beraca Education Center in Jeremie, our resource center provides a safe and welcoming space where students and young professionals can access laptops, high-speed internet, and reliable electricity—resources most don't have at home or school.

We use a solar-powered energy system, so we are not dependent upon the city's electrical grid, which has been mostly non-operational for the last 3 years.

The center is equipped with a large screen and conference table, making it ideal for university classes, professional training, presentations, and meetings. We also host sessions for other organizations and educational institutions.

Additionally, the space serves as a hub for mentor-student meetings and program activities, becoming a strategic connection point for young leaders and entrepreneurs in Jeremie.



Technology

What We Provide

High-Speed Internet

We provide consistent, high-speed internet that supports streaming, video conferencing, and high performance across many devices simultaneously.

Laptops

Students can use laptops at our resource center for free, and if they have a personal laptop, they can come and connect to our wireless network.

Solar Powered Electricity

Our resource center is completely solar-powered, so we have 24/7 electricity even though the city of Jeremie does not.

Clean Drinking Water

We provide treated drinking water free for all of our guests.

Conferences/Meetings/ Seminars

We support local institutions and organizations by making this space available for conferences, meetings, and training seminars.



URH Partnership

We partner with the University of the Renaissance (URH) in Jeremie, Haiti.

URH serves approximately 300 students each year, and despite severe underfunding and limited resources caused by Haiti's economic crisis, it delivers high-quality education, and we provide resources through our partnership to strengthen its impact.

Electricity

We donated batteries to enable URH to upgrade their solar energy system, and we provided them with a high-quality generator.

Laptops

We donated laptops and purchased network equipment so they can provide a computer lab for their students.

Hi-Speed Internet

We provide high-speed internet for the URH campus that is available for their students, classrooms, faculty, and administration.

Scholarships

We provide scholarships to URH students.





Mentoring

Connecting university students to qualified mentors who provide support and encouragement.



Mentoring

How it Works

Our university students are paired with carefully selected mentors who provide guidance from their personal experience. Mentors complete training, regularly meet with students, and stay connected via phone or text. Both students and mentors consistently describe these relationships as transformative, highlighting the profound impact of mentorship on academic and personal growth.

19 Students + 19 Mentors

Each of our university students in Jeremie is matched with a personal mentor.

Student/Mentor Meetings

We host regular meetings for all of the mentors and mentees in our program. During these meetings, students and mentors have the chance to share and discuss as a group.

Guest Speakers

We frequently invite inspiring leaders from the community to share with the students at our student/mentor meetings.


Breakdown of how we invested the money we raised for the 2024-25 fiscal year.
